

ORDINANCE NO. 1861

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DAYTON, WASHINGTON, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1844, CHAPTER 4-6 SECTION 20 - MONTHLY GARBAGE RATES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2014.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of DAYTON as follows:

Section 1. Amendment of DMC 4-6.20. Section 4-6.20 of the Dayton Municipal Code (DMC) is hereby amended to read as follows:

DMC 4-6.20 Rate Schedule. The basic charges for the collection of garbage shall not exceed the following rates as follows:

Residential	One 105 gallon container, 1 x per week	\$19.00/month
Residential	One 300 gallon container, 1 x per week	\$102.25/month
Commercial	One 105 gallon container, 1 x per week	\$19.25/month
Commercial	One 300 gallon container, 1 x per week	\$102.25/month
Commercial	One 105 gallon container, additional pick-up	\$ 3.20/ week
Commercial	One 300 gallon container, additional pick-up	\$17.10/week

Section 2. Purpose. This schedule of monthly charges is hereby established for garbage collection for all businesses, residences and premises within the City of Dayton, Washington. Excess or additional garbage shall be charged at the contractor's cost.


Section 3. Payments. Payment of monthly charges for the collection of garbage from all businesses, residences and premises within the City of Dayton shall be made by the owner and/or occupant thereof to Basin Disposal Services, Inc. on or before the 10th of each month at the office of Basin Disposal, Inc.

Section 4 Upon passage by the Council and publication as required by law, the garbage rates established herein shall take effect on August 1, 2014. The rates set forth in DMC 4-6.20 which are amended by this ordinance shall remain in force and effect until the rates set forth in this ordinance go into effect.

Section 5. Severability. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the other remaining parts which shall remain in full force and effect.


Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance, being an exercise of a power specifically delegated to the City legislative body, is not subject to referendum, and shall take effect five (5) days after passage and publication of an approved summary thereof consisting of the title.
