Re: 2024 Budgets and Resolutions

Dear Taxing District:

It is that time of year again. Budgets are to be set and Resolutions written and turned into me no later than Thursday, November 30, 2023. **You must have a public hearing prior to this date setting your budget certification amount for 2024** so get those hearing dates set and advertised in the local paper.

I am providing you with the amount on which you need to calculate the one percent increase. Remember, you can set your budget for whatever amount you think you will need for 2024, however, you will only receive a maximum of 1% over and above what you could have received for 2023 plus an amount for new construction in your district and any increases in the state utility values. State utility value increases are not a "given" due to the fact they do not go up in value every year, I so not know what will happen this year. As you know, the last two years the values have gone down. I will not be able to provide you with actual amounts until mid-November when I receive the utility values from the state. If you have "banked levy dollars" you may increase your budget more than the 1%, IF statutory limits allow the increase, you will need to see me on this issue.

Keep in mind that taxable values can change through the end of the year due to Senior Citizen/Disabled Persons exemptions so what you request may not always be what you will receive.

ALL taxing districts must certify their budgets to the Columbia County Commissioners BUT please deliver a copy of your budget and the completed forms to me as has been done in the past and I will take to our Commissioners. New Levy Certification and Resolution/Ordinance forms are enclosed for you to use. **PLEASE use these new forms. Failure to use a proper resolution or ordinance **WILL** result in you **NOT** receiving any tax money for the 2024 tax year. This is a directive from the State Department of Revenue.**

Certifications and Resolutions/Ordinances need to be to the Assessor no later than November 30, 2023 but sooner would be better. Actual budgets and copies of your resolutions must also be provided to the Columbia County Chief Accountant Deputy, Sadie Gregg.

All districts must turn in a resolution and indicate on said resolution the budget amount requested in total dollars AND percentage of increase.

There should be no substitutions for these forms or the changing of the content thereof. It is in your best interest and to your benefit to use the forms provided.

Please contact me with any questions you may have. I am more than happy to help you with the forms so do not hesitate to contact me.
