RESOLUTION NO. 1461

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DAYTON, WASHINGTON AUTHORIZING THE COMMUNITY FOOD BANK OF DAYTON TO MAKE IMPROVEMENTS TO THE SOUTHERN PORTION OF 111 S. 1ST STREET, DAYTON, WA, 99328

WHEREAS, in 2009 the City of Dayton and the Community Food Bank of Dayton entered into a Facility Use Agreement pursuant to which the Community Food Bank of Dayton has since 2009 used one or more City Hall parking bays (herein the "Premises") for the purpose of providing free food to residents of Dayton and Columbia County; and

WHEREAS, the 2009 Facility Use Agreement provides at Section 3(b) that the Community Food Bank of Dayton "shall make no improvements or alternations to the Garage or the premises without formal written approval of any improvements or alternations by the Dayton City Council"; and

WHEREAS, the Community Food Bank of Dayton has informed the City of its desire to make capital improvements to the Premises, at its own expense, to improve its services and meet federal, state and local requirements for storing and distributing food items for consumption by the underprivileged and ailing; and,

WHEREAS, the improvements proposed by the Community Food Bank of Dayton will include installing a new roof, replacing the interior wood panel ceiling, installing a new overhead door, and installing cooler and freezer storage units; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the Community Food Bank of Dayton provides an important public service, and that authorizing the Community Food Bank of Dayton to make the requested improvements will promote the public health, safety and welfare;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DAYTON, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to Section 3(b) of the 2009 Facility Use Agreement, the City Council hereby authorizes the Community Food Bank of Dayton to make improvements the Premises, to include installing a new roof, replacing the interior wood panel ceiling, installing a new overhead door, and installing cooler and freezer storage units.

SECTION 2. This Resolution shall take effect and be in full force upon its approval.
