3. SPECIAL GUESTS/PUBLIC COMMENT

Michael Smith, Dayton Historic Preservation Commission Chairman, reports Dayton received a Certificate of Recognition from National Parks for being a Certified Local Government since March 1, 1992. Dayton is one of 19,666 cities in the Nation to be a Certified Local Government.

Mr. Smith further reports that Sam Boldman poured the first curbs and sidewalks of Dayton on S. 1st Street in 1910. In honor of his masonry craftsmanship and a piece of Dayton's history, one of the curb corners stamped with "S.L. Boldman 1910" will be preserved and re-installed on either the southeast corner of E. Tremont Street or of E. Park Street as a Dayton historical marker.

4. COMMITTEE/BOARD/ COMMISSIONER REPORTS

Public Safety – Bailey asks if the S. 1st Street road closure signs may be relocated to reduce the lack of visibility when exiting Elk Drug. Discussion ensues. Staff will contact contractor to discuss mitigation measures.

Public Works – There is no report.

Finance – There is no report.

Parks/Public Grounds – George reports that the dog park fence was installed, the project is 95% complete and dog park signage will be the next step. Bailey recommends that the sign be minimal in its content size. Berg conveys that the fence was installed with assistance from members of the Dayton First Congregational Church – UCC.

Planning/Economic Development – There is no report.

Personnel – Paris reports that union negotiations will begin in August.

Emergency Management – There is no report.

Chamber of Commerce – Berg reports that the Dayton Chamber website is under construction and XO Alambic Distillery will hold a grand opening July 14.

Commissioners – There is no report.

5. REPORTS OF CITY OFFICERS

Sheriff – Joe Helm, Columbia County Sheriff Deputy, reports the Office is in process of hiring a new deputy to fill one vacancy and utilize the new hire for road deputy duties; and, July 4 was uneventful.

Code Compliance – Atteberry reports that compliance focus is currently on dry grass and weeds to reduce potential fire hazards.

Public Works – Costello reports that the water line has been installed in S. 1^{st} Street Project. Next phase will be to install the Oak Street and S. 2^{nd} Street waterline.

Planning Director – Scharer reports: 1) Met Department of Commerce to discuss Dayton's Comprehensive Plan update and grant funding opportunities to fund its update. She states that she is currently working on the Comprehensive Plan Housing Element's Objective and Goals; 2) Dayton Development Task Force has created a façade improvement mini-grant program. Properties eligible for application must be located within the Main Street Program boundaries; and 3) Friends of the Dog Park was awarded \$500 from the Warren Fund to assist with the purchase and construction of the dog park fence.

City Clerk-Treasurer – Cole reports that Heather Ball, Dayton Pool Manager, received a grant for \$3,500 from the Blue Mountain Community Foundation - Columbia County Fund to purchase new umbrellas, chairs and pool paint.

Mayor Pro-Tempore – There is no report.

Mayor – George reports the following: 1) The City received a letter from Columbia County Commissioners requesting negotiations for both the court services and law enforcement services contracts; 2) Monday's council meeting dates pose a conflict for a councilmember and asks Council if moving meetings to one Wednesday per month would be acceptable. Discussion follows specific to potential meeting dates. Council informally supports the 2nd Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. George directs Cole to draft an ordinance as such for Council's consideration at the next regular meeting; 3) Reads letters from Touchet Valley Arts Council, Merle Jackson, Mr. & Mrs. Joe Barth and Dayton All-Wheels Weekend Committee thanking and commending the Public Works Department for their hard work and dedication to Dayton.

RE:	Agenda Item No. 4(A) - Winter Storm Damages To Various City Streets

As you know, several streets were damaged from the severe winter weather Dayton experienced, specifically during January 30 – February 22, 2017 ("Incident Period"). On April 21, 2017, the President of the United States of America declared this incident period as a Major Disaster. This declaration will fund the repair of any damaged facilities/streets from that incident period.

The City attended a Recovery Scoping meeting on May 22 and a Kick-Off meeting June 20, 2017 with state and federal representatives to identify projects. Attached is a list of streets that were identified as damaged during the Incident Period (Attachment "A") and are eligible for Public Assistance ("PA") funding. This funding does come with strings attached specifically pertaining to match requirements.

The reimbursement ratio for the PA Program is as follows: Federal -75%, City 25%. If the project is eligible for FEMA funding, the State typically provides financial support up to 12.5% (if the legislature does not approve the capital budget, then the City may be responsible for the entire 25%).

Based on the estimates we received from Anderson Perry & Associates the total cost of repairs is approximately \$744, 226. FEMA will cover \$558,169.50 (as long as all damages are deemed eligible by FEMA and the State) and the City's responsibility could be up to \$186,056.50. If the State kicks in 12.5%, as has historically been the case for disasters, then the City's portion would be \$93,028. We do not have a definitive answer regarding the State's portion at this time; therefore, the Mayor and staff are researching additional funding sources to cover the City's portion of the FEMA Street Repairs Project.

Also, FEMA's reimbursement schedule may not be conducive to meeting a contractor's payment schedule. As a result, the City may be required to obtain interim financing to complete these repairs. Additional information will be provided once the project's eligibility is determined at the federal/state levels.

Finally, and although unfortunate, this repair work will likely not be undertaken until the Spring of 2018.

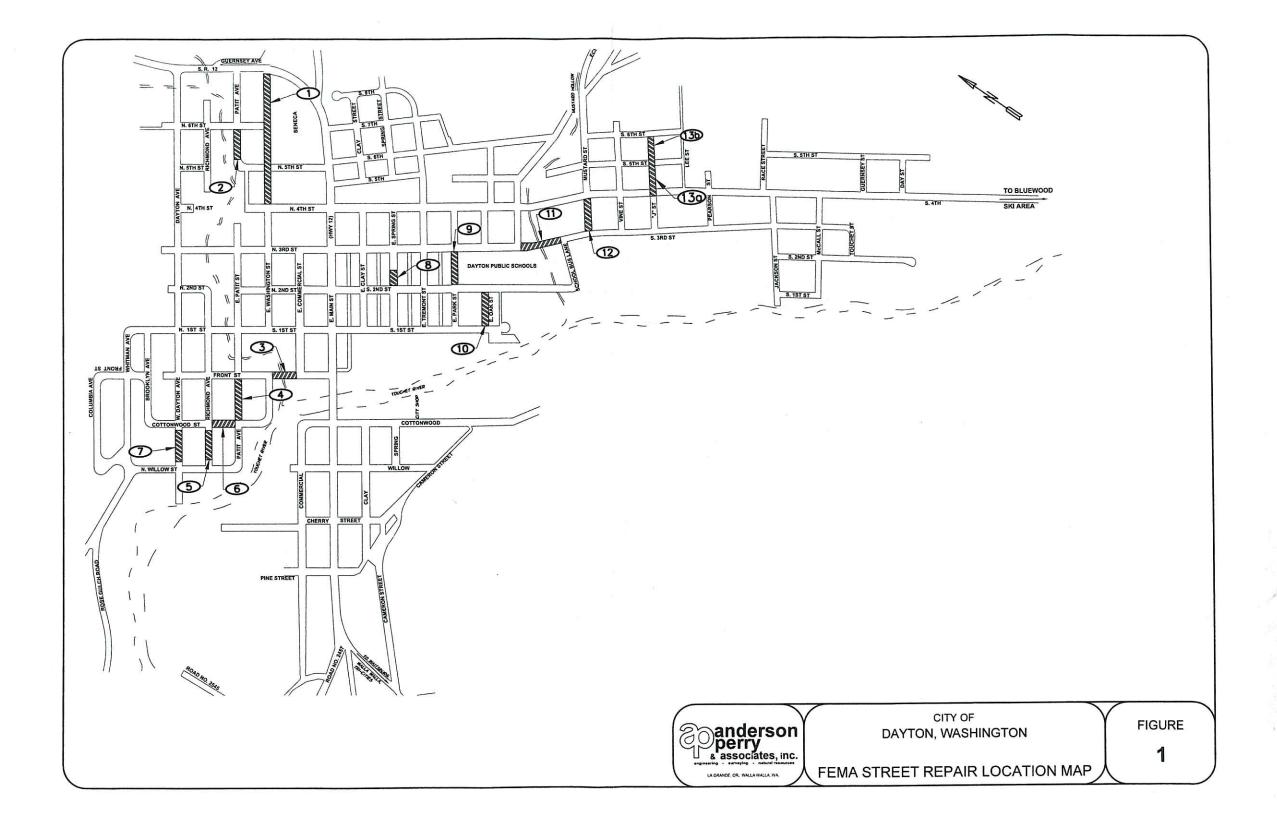

RESOLUTION NO. 1315

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DAYTON, COLUMBIA COUNTY, WASHINGTON, DESIGNATING AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIONS TO OBTAIN FEDERAL AND/OR STATE EMERGENCY OR DISASTER ASSSITANCE FUNDS ASSOCIATED WITH DISASTER FEMA-DR-4309-WA, JANUARY 30 TO FEBRUARY 22, 2017

WHEREAS, the City of Dayton ("City") experienced significant winter storm damage to various city facilities January 30 through February 22,2017; and

WHEREAS, there was a Presidential Declaration by Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") declaring the winter storm incident between January 30 through February 22, 2017 as a Disaster, No. FEMA-DR-4309-WA; and

WHEREAS, the City's facilities are eligible for relief through FEMA's Public Assistance Program; and

WHEREAS, federal and/or state agencies Contracting Office's require that the City designate an Applicant Agent; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant's Agent will have the responsibilities of point of contact and completing and/or signing all required documentation to obtain federal and/or state emergency or disaster funds for Disaster No. FEMA-DR-4309-WA; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that Craig George, Mayor shall serve as Authorized Agent; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that Trina Cole, City Clerk-Treasurer shall serve as an Alternate Applicant Agent.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DAYTON, WASHINGTON, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Craig George, Mayor, is hereby designated the Authorized Agent/Representative, for and in behalf of the City of Dayton, Washington, a public agency established under the laws of the State of Washington.

Section 2. Trina Cole, City Clerk-Treasurer is hereby designated the alternate to the Authorized Agent/Representative, for and in behalf of the City of Dayton, Washington, a public agency established under the laws of the State of Washington.

Section 3. These representatives are authorized on behalf of the City of Dayton to execute all contracts, certify completion of projects, request payments, and prepare all required documentation for funding requirements.

Section 4. That this Resolution shall take effect and be in full force upon passage and signatures hereon.

ORDINANCE NO. 1918

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DAYTON, WASHINGTON, AMENDING ORDINANCE 1905, SECTION 04 OF TITLE 1 CHAPTER 2 OF THE DAYTON MUNICIPAL CODE, REGULAR MEETINGS

WHEREAS, RCW 42.30.070 requires the City Council to designate the time that regular City Council meetings shall be held; and WHEREAS, the City Council discussed which day and/or days to hold regular City Council meetings at their July 10, 2017 meeting; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to change most regular meeting days to the 2^{nd} Wednesday of each month except as provided in Section 1-2.04.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF CITY OF DAYTON, WASHINGTON, DO HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Ordinance 1905, Section 04 of Title 1, Chapter 2 of the Dayton Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

1-2.04 - Regular City Council meetings.

A. The regular meeting of the City Council for the City of Dayton, Washington, shall be held on the second Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m., except for the following:

- 1. December's City Council meetings shall be held on the <u>first and third Monday</u> of that month at 7:00 p.m.
- 2. Should any meeting fall on a legal holiday, then such meeting shall be held the next regular business day at the same date, time and location.

SECTION 2.SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the other remaining parts which shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. A summary thereof of this Ordinance consisting of its title shall be published in the

official newspaper of the City, and shall take effect and be in full force September 1, 2017.

RESOLUTION NO. 1316

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DAYTON, COLUMBIA COUNTY, WASHINGTON, AUTHORIZING CHANGE ORDER #1 TO THE S. 1ST STREET RECONSTRUCTION AND OAK STREET/S. 2ND STREET MAIN LINE REPLACEMENT PROJECT TO INCLUDE WORK ASSOCIATED WITH THE TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT BOARD EMERGENCY REPAIR PROGRAM GRANT

WHEREAS, the City of Dayton entered into a contract with POW Constracting, Inc., for the S. 1st Street Reconstruction and Oak Street/S. 2nd Street Main line Replacement Project on May 2, 2017; and

WHEREAS, Change Order No. 1 is required to increase the S. 1st Street Reconstruction and Oak Street/S. 2nd Street Main line Replacement Project contract amount to include the changes associated with the Transportation Improvement Board Emergency Repair Program Grant as set forth in the attached Change Order #1; and

WHEREAS, the additional work associated with Change Order #1 will be completed by August 31, 2017; and

WHEREAS, such additions have been reviewed and approved by the City Engineer and Public Works Director; and

WHEREAS, the attached itemized additions result in a net increase of \$53,625.00 to the original price of \$1,167,431.32 for a total contract price of \$1,221,056.32 which is an increase in the original contract price of 4.59%.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DAYTON, WASHINGTON, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:
