

**RESOLUTION NO. 1411**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DAYTON, COLUMBIA COUNTY, WASHINGTON TO TEMPORARILY WAIVING FEES ASSOCIATED WITH BUILDING PERMITS DUE TO THE FLOODING EVENT FEBRUARY 7, 2020 - FEBRUARY 10, 2020.**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Dayton experienced flooding beginning February 6, 2020 through February 10, 2020 where individual citizens and public infrastructure of the City incurred damages; and,

**WHEREAS**, on February 7, 2020, as affirmed on February 18, 2020, the City Council declared the event an emergency; and

**WHEREAS**, the City desires to relieve residents of the burden of building permit associated with response and recovery efforts from the flood; and,

**WHEREAS**, the permit fee waiver shall apply only to that construction or repair that is necessary for restoration to pre-flood conditions; and

**WHEREAS**, to be eligible for a fee waiver, the permit applicant shall provide access to the structure for the purpose of damage assessment by City personnel; and

**WHEREAS**, waiving these fees will remove cost burden from private citizens and enable a costly and efficient recovery by the community.

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DAYTON, WASHINGTON, DOES HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:**


**SECTION 1: BUILDING PERMIT FEE WAIVER.** Building permit applications fees, plan review fees, safety inspections, and other applicable building permit costs pursuant to adopted City ordinance and resolutions shall be waived until April 1, 2020 for construction and repair work (1) associated with property directly impacted by the flooding event during February 7-10, 2020, and (2) intended to restore such property to pre-flood conditions. The decision whether any fee may be waived pursuant to this section shall be made by the City's Director of Planning and Community Development and may not be appealed.

**SECTION 2. AUTHORITY.** The Mayor and his designee(s) are hereby authorized to implement such administrative procedures as may be necessary to carry out the directions of this legislation.


**SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Resolution shall take effect and be in full force upon its approval.


