Applicant: City of Dayton, Washington, 111 S. 1st St., Dayton, WA 99328

Proposal: The City of Dayton proposes to develop a wetland complex consisting of a series of up to six wetland cells ranging in size from approximately two to five acres to provide additional treatment and polishing of the City's treated wastewater effluent. The City's wastewater will be treated off-site and pumped to the proposed project site after it has been treated to NPDES Permit standards.
