2. CONSENT AGENDA:

Action: Bailey makes a motion to approve the February 25, 2013 Council Minutes as presented.

3. SPECIAL GUESTS/PUBLIC COMMENT

Action:

Berg opens the public hearing at 7:03 p.m. to hear public comment on the Suffield Short Plat. Lyonnais summarizes the Application for Short Plat, Staff Report and Findings of Fact recommending the approval of the Suffield Short Plat. Berg supports approval of the proposed short plat. Nysoe inquires about the review role by Council. Lyonnais explains that typically review would be done by the Planning Commission; however, there currently is not a quorum. Nysoe asks what is being done about the lack of quorum status. Lyonnais explains that the City and County are in discussion of creating a joint planning commission. Bailey makes a motion to approve the Suffield Short Plat as presented. Nysoe seconds the motion. There is no discussion. Motion carries unanimously. Danon Griffen asks if the proposed Suffield Short Plat boundaries will affect his property boundaries. Lyonnais responds no and explains that the Suffield Short Plat Boundary only affects the property at 506 N. 2nd Street. Jim Kime, 501 E. Richmond Avenue, asks for a description of the easterly lot's access point. Lyonnais explains that the access point is located south of $506\ N_{\odot}$ 2^{nd} Street. Mr. Kime inquires whether the City contacted the Hospital District regarding the Short Plat. Lyonnais states yes. Mr. Kime asks if setbacks from the propane tanks were considered. Lyonnais states that the location of development in correlation with propane tanks will be considered upon submittal of a site plan for development on the property. Public hearing is closed at 7: 26 p.m.

Bailey interjects that part-time position was also advertised for potential full-time status and Cole took this into consideration when budgeting. Nysoe inquires what a long-term position entails. Cole responds permanent. Hall makes a motion to reclassify the City Planner position from part-time status to a full-status position. Bailey seconds the motion. There is no discussion. Motion carries unanimously.
